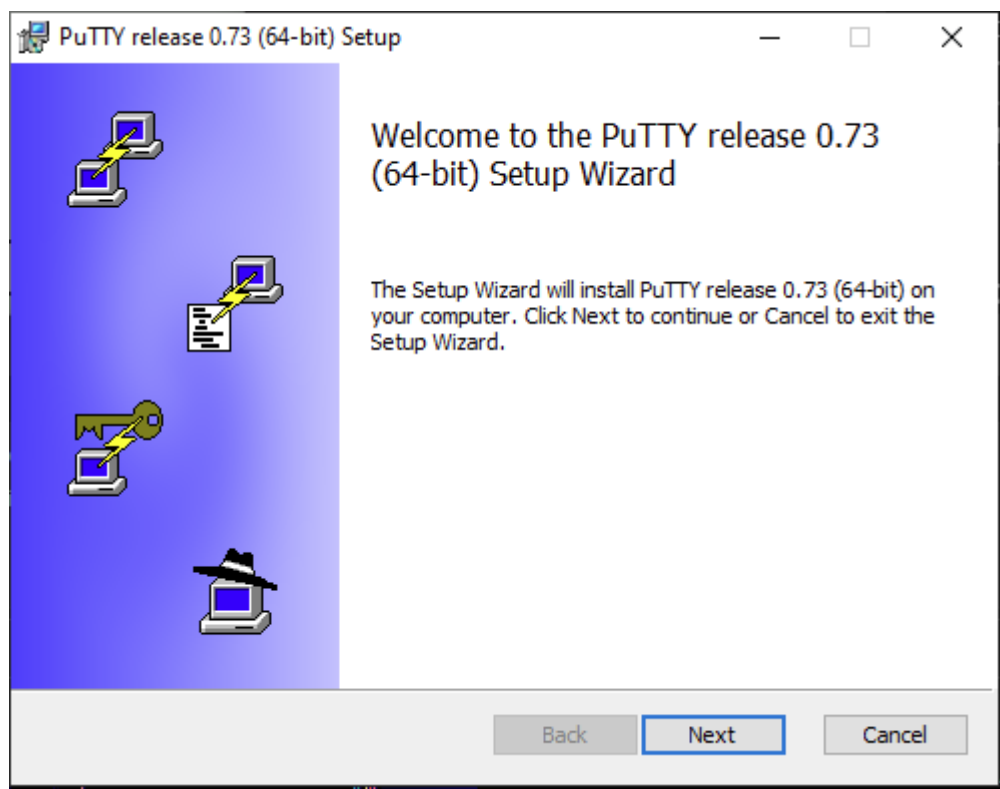
Package files

(Not sure whether you want the 32-bit or the 64-bit version? Read the [FAQ entry](#).)

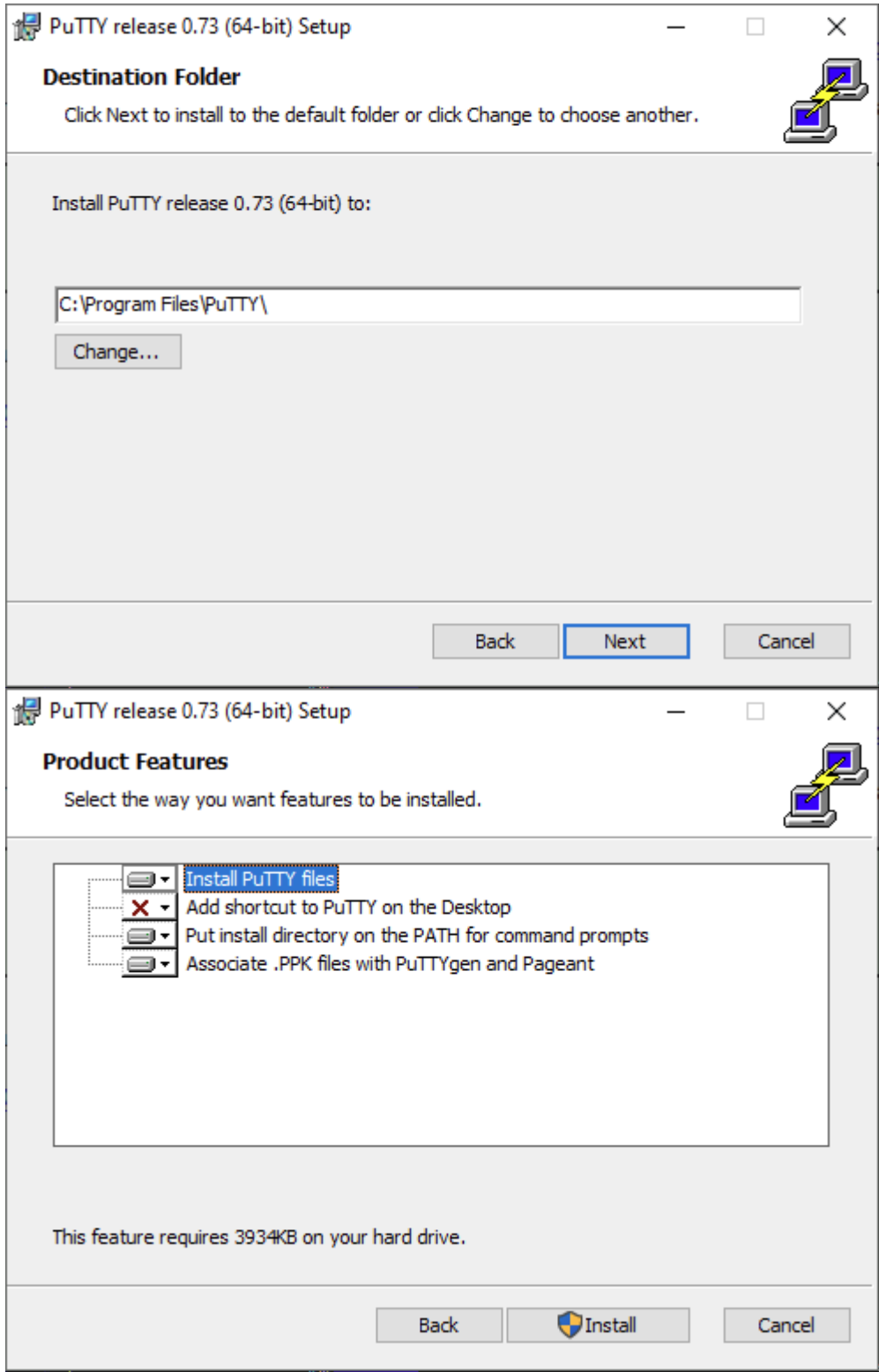
MSI ('Windows Installer')

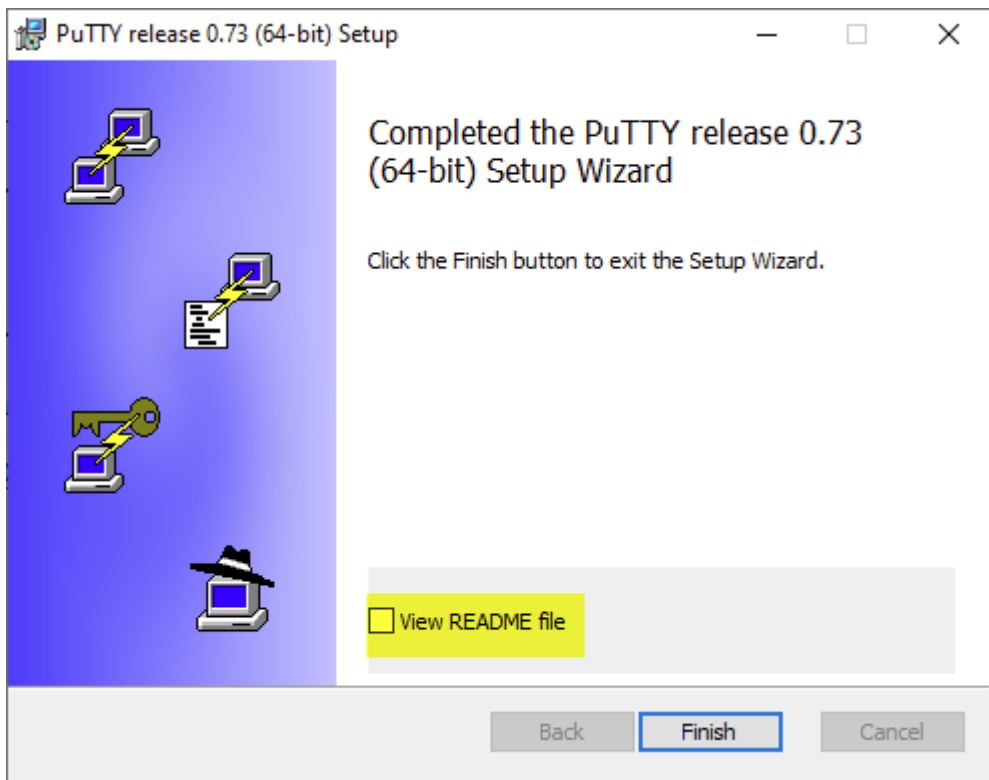
32-bit:	putty-0.73-installer.msi	(or by FTP)	(signature)
64-bit:	putty-64bit-0.73-installer.msi	(or by FTP)	(signature)

Download the last release of putty :

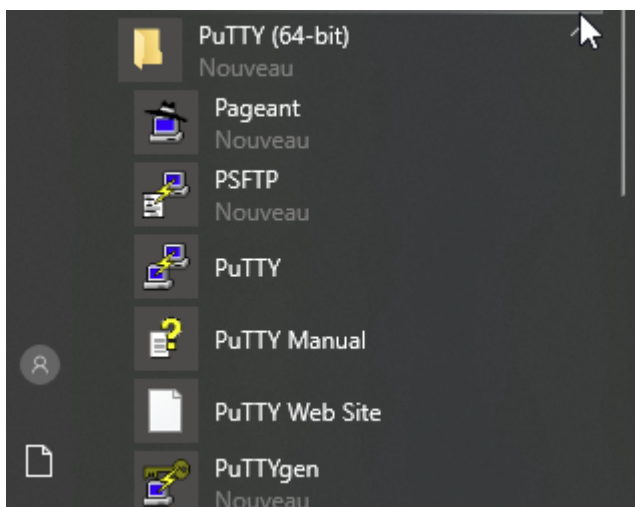


Start install of putty :

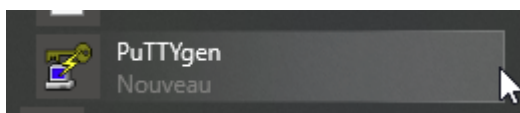




In the start menu you have multiple new applications under PuTTY folder :

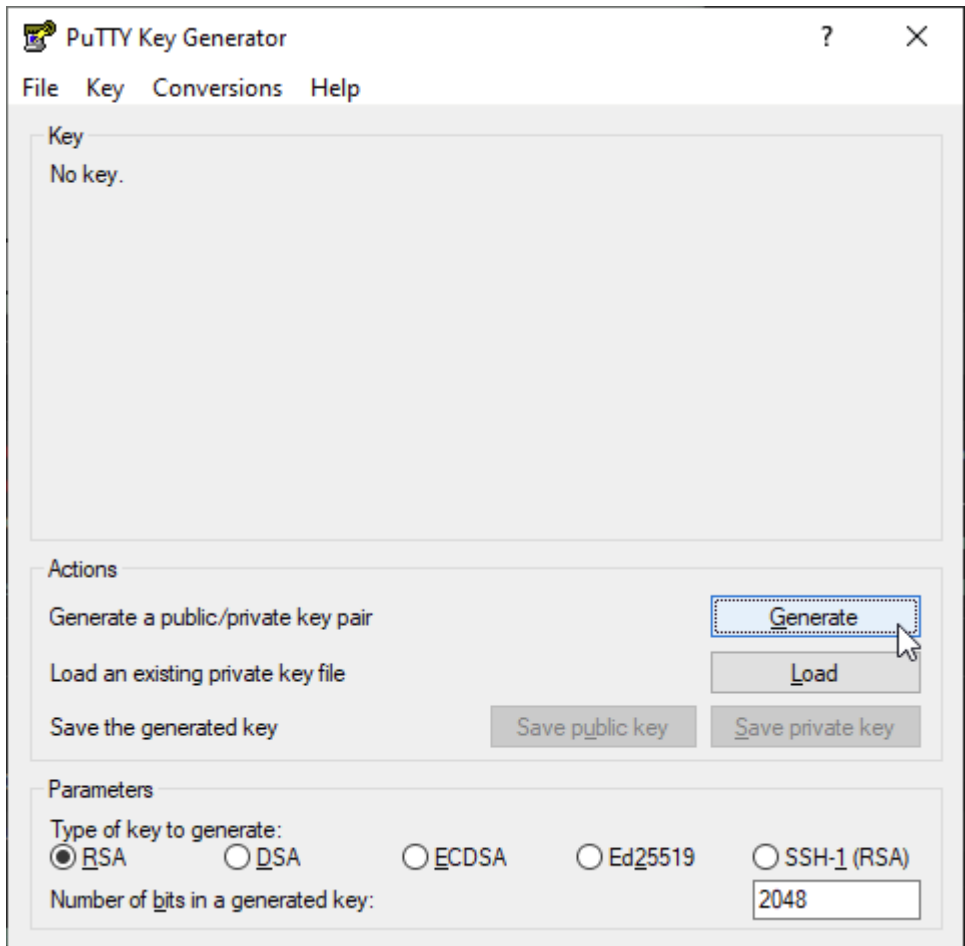


First step is to generate the SSH key. For this run the PuTTYgen

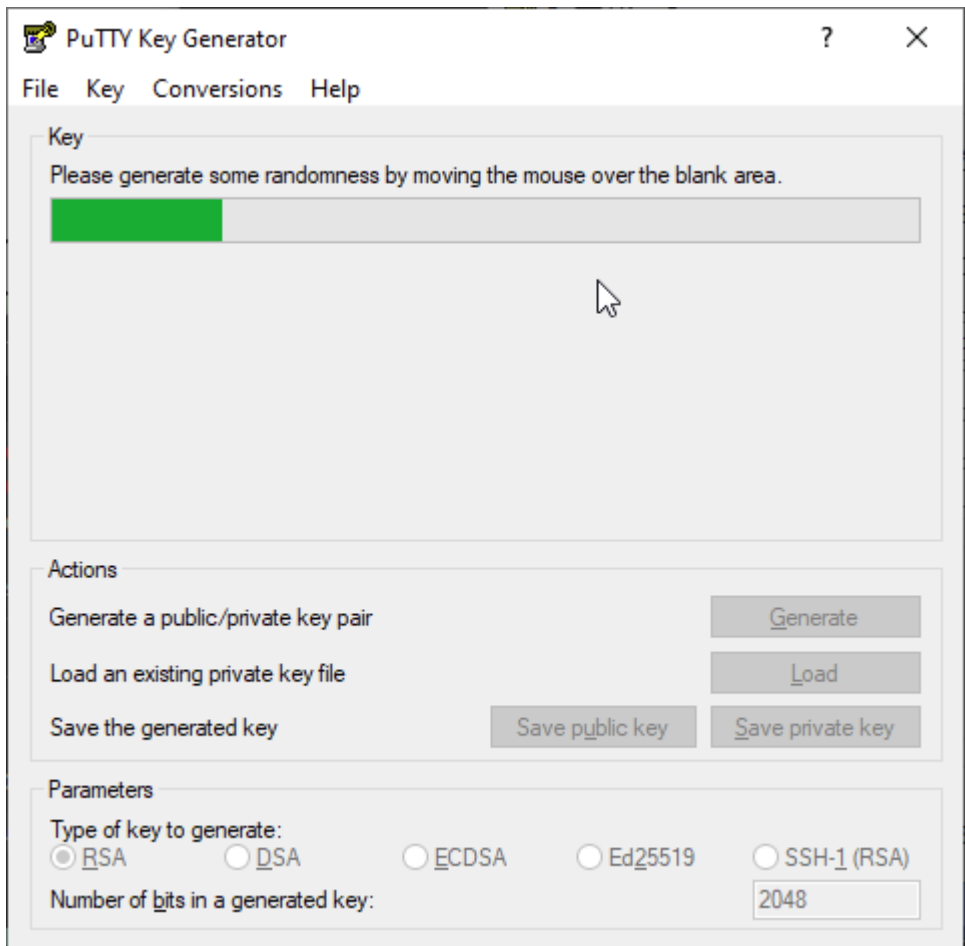


Click on Generate button

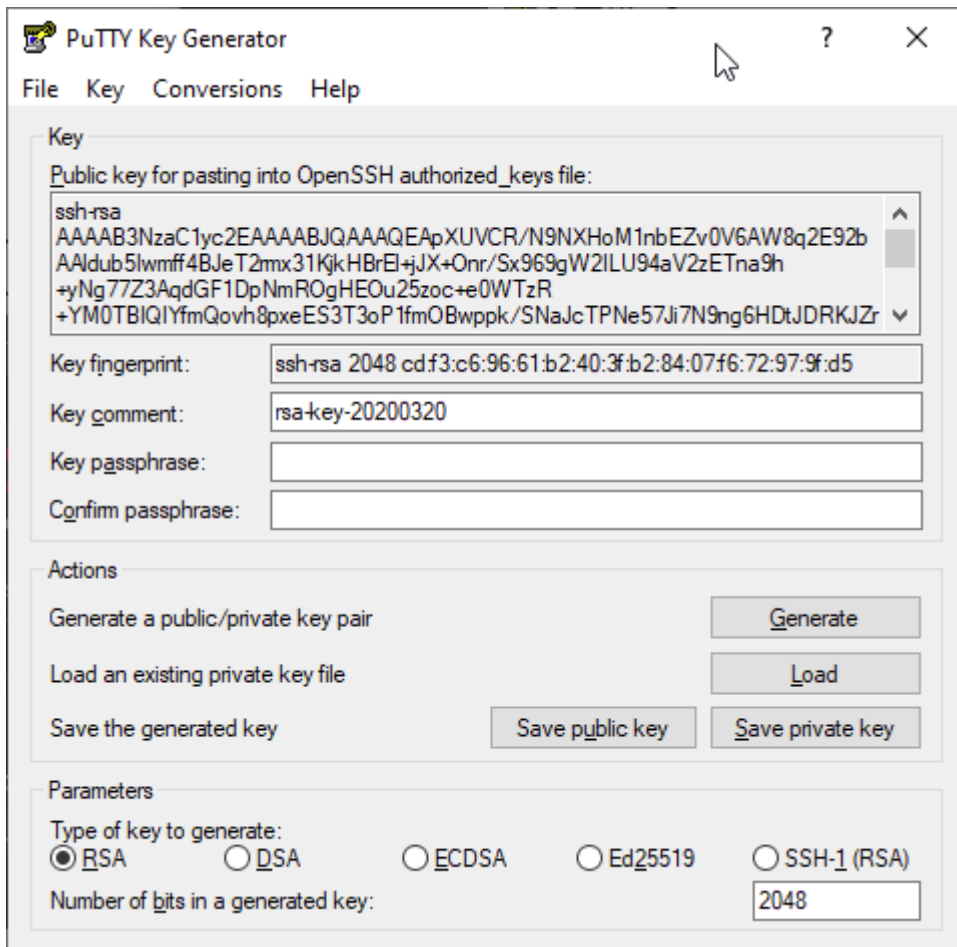
You need to move the mouse over the window



When completed you will get a new key

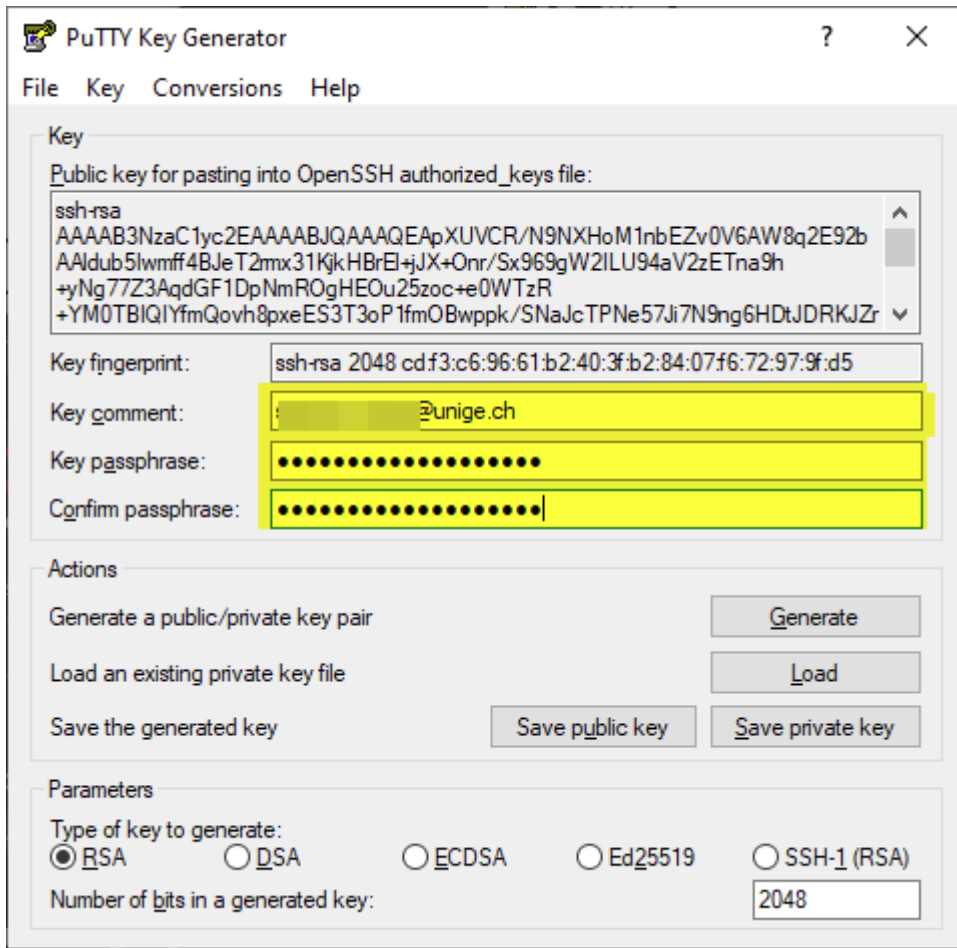


Before saving the key update the fields

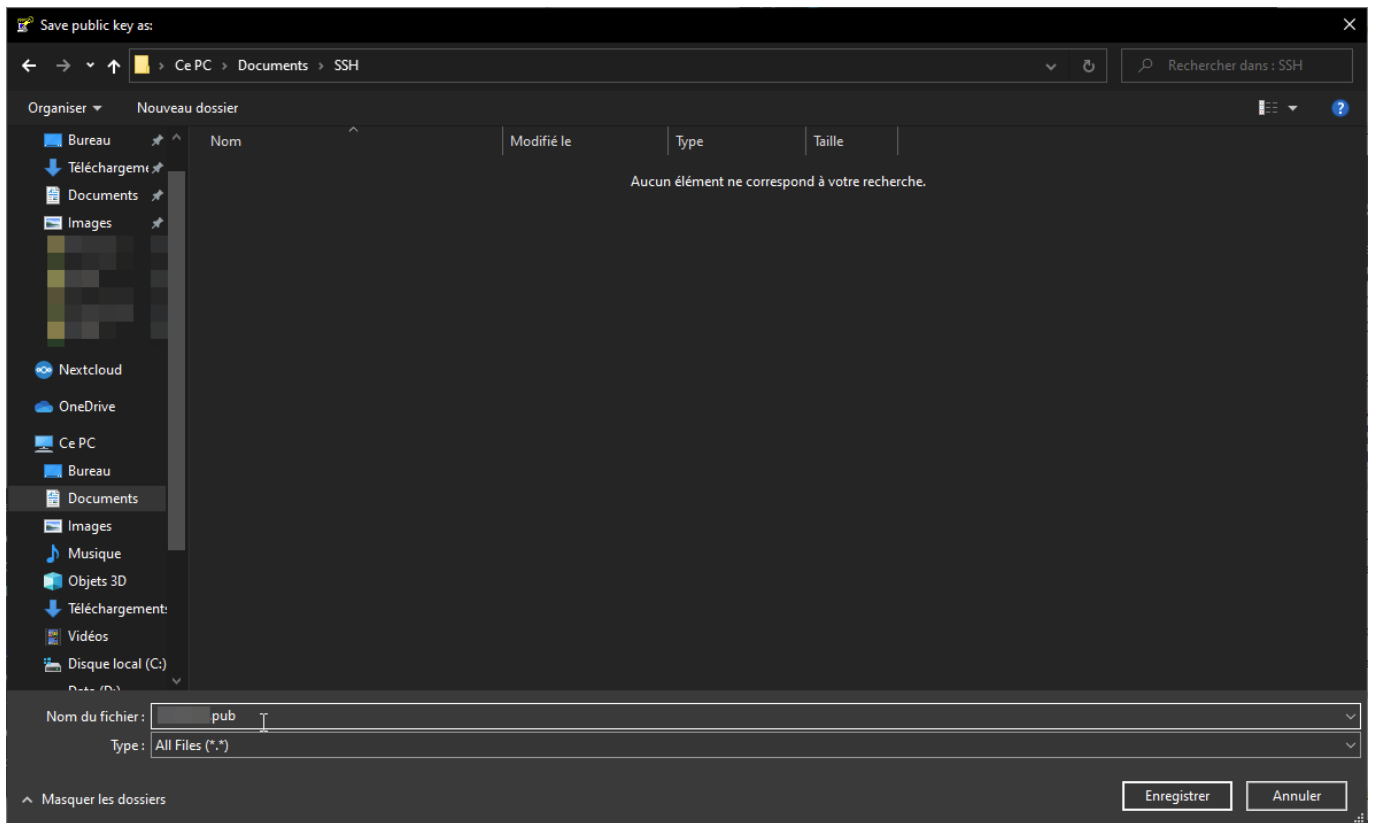


In key comment put you email address

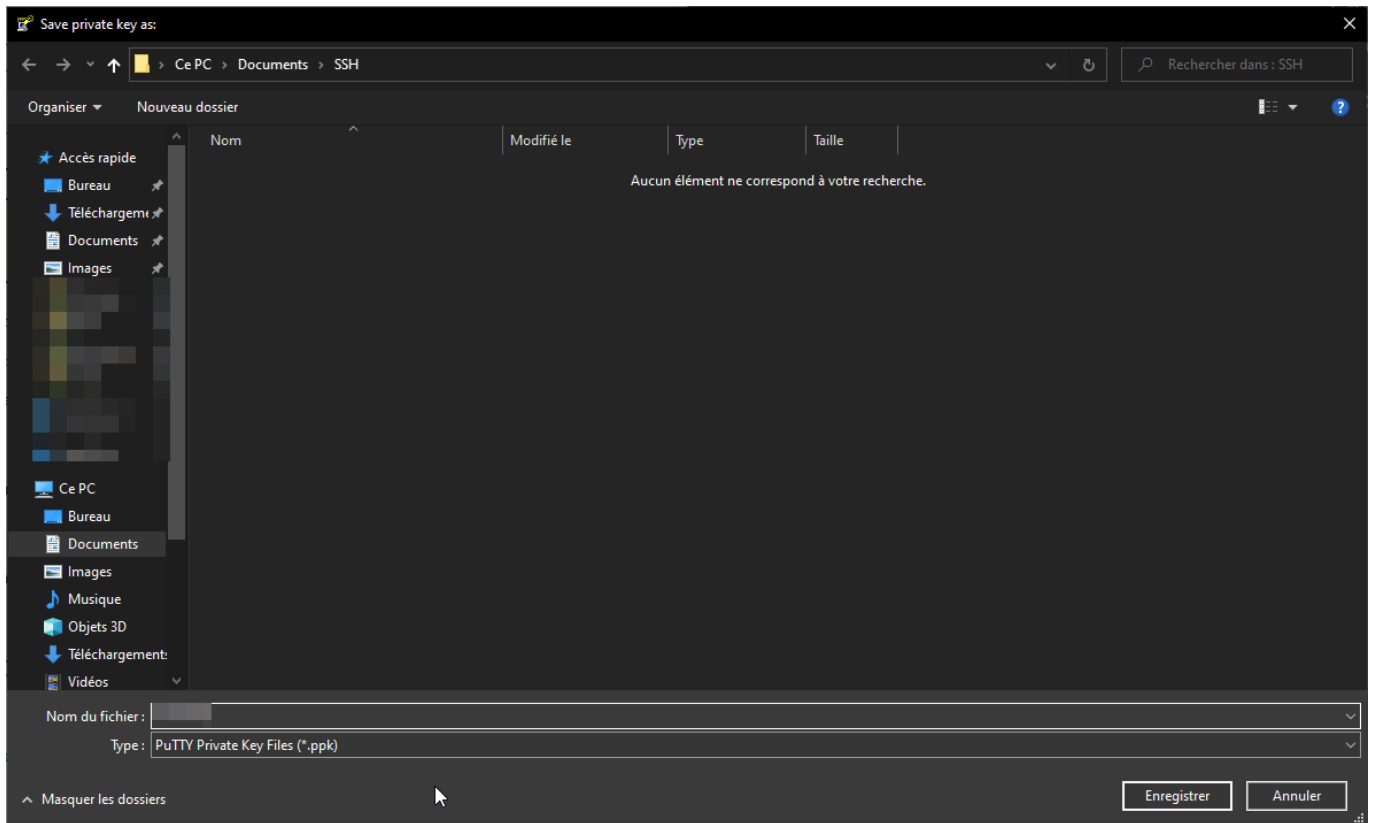
And enter a passphrase



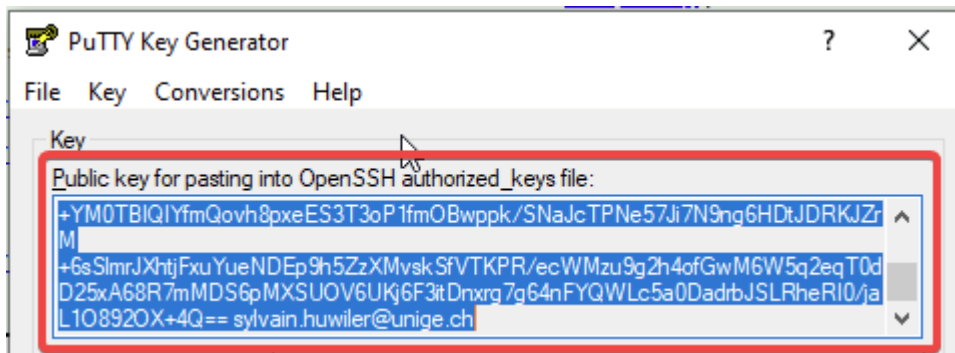
Save the public key on you computer
